

Basic Visa Entry Information

Citizens of the United States, European Union, and Turkiye are not required to obtain a visa for entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Important Notice:

The visa application process may take a considerable amount of time. Applicants are strongly advised to submit their visa applications well in advance of their intended travel date to avoid any potential delays.

Countries whose citizens typically require a visa include, but are not limited to: India, Pakistan, Iraq, Iran, Syria, and a number of African countries.

Special Note:

Citizens who hold a valid multiple-entry Schengen visa or a valid visa for an EU member state may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without a visa for a stay of up to 30 days, provided that the visa remains valid for the duration of their stay.

Required Documentation for a Tourist Visa:

- A passport valid for at least 90 days beyond the intended visa expiry date
- A completed and signed visa application form, including a recent photograph
- A certified invitation letter / guarantee letter issued by a citizen or legal entity in Bosnia and Herzegovina
- Proof of accommodation (e.g. hotel reservation or certified invitation letter)
- Proof of sufficient financial means to cover the duration of stay (e.g. bank statement)
- Valid travel health insurance covering Bosnia and Herzegovina
- A return flight ticket or other proof of intention to leave Bosnia and Herzegovina

These requirements apply to all nationalities that are subject to visa regulations for entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina and who do not hold a valid multiple-entry Schengen visa.

Submission of Application:

Applicants are required to submit their visa applications at the nearest Embassy or Consulate of Bosnia and Herzegovina in their country of residence.
